

Aim/context

To be able to count up in 1's, 2's or 10's.

Age group 5/6 years

The children will be able to find any value up to 20p using 2p coins (even values only).

Find any value-denomination of 10p up to £2(only use 10p coins to find values like 30p,£1.50 etc)

Objectives

To be able to count on or back in 2's.

To be able to count on or back in 10's.

To be able to solve money problems.

Teacher tips

Previous knowledge or experience needed

- The children should have had a lot of opportunities to count sets of objects up to 20.
- They should be able to count on and back in 2's and 10's.
- They should have experience of using 2 and 10 pence coins.

Resources

Counting stick, to count in 2's, 10's.

Activity sheet 2 What's my value?

Key questions/prompts

Can they read the total number that they are looking for?

Model counting on in time with clicking on the 2/10 pence pieces.

Ask the children to count the total number of coins that they have and the corresponding value at regular intervals.

Group activity ideas

1. Hide money in the sand/water tray and the children need to find them and count how many they have found.
2. Use **Activity sheet 2** What's my value? The sheet shows a purse with the value inside, give out some coins and ask the children to make rubbings of the right number of 2/10 pence coins to make the total value.
3. Plan a treasure hunt in the outdoor space, the children could follow a map to find 2 pence coins and then count them into the treasure chest at the end of the hunt. They could earn points for finding the most coins.

Cross curricular links

PSHE:

Realise that money comes from different sources and can be used for different purposes

Spoken language:

Listen and respond appropriately to adults and their peers; participate in discussions

I can recognise and know the value of coins I use
